What is Fostering?

Sometimes children live with a different family than who they are used to.

This is a foster family.

We make sure that they are looking after you and making sure you are safe. We have chosen this family specially to care for you.



Children live with different families for lots of reasons. Sometimes it is for a short time and sometimes you are there for what feels like a long time. You may even have your Birthday there. But your foster family will make sure it is still a special time for you.

You will have a social worker who will come to visit you and help make a plan about what might happen next.







Your foster family want to make sure that there is someone to look after you if you don't feel well, and someone to talk to if you are feeling sad.



• We know that sometimes you might find you have lots of questions. You might feel sad, worried or angry. But you don't have to worry. We will make sure you have someone there for you if you need to talk about anything. If, for any reason you don't feel you can talk to your foster parents or your social worker about things you are not happy with you can contact someone at Homefinding. You might have already met Lauren or Jess as they organise all our fun days out together.
